

FIG.1-TYPICAL FORWARD CURRENT DERATING CURVE




FIG.3-MAXIMUM NON-REPETITIVE FORWARD SURGE CURRENT




FIG.4-TYPICAL JUNCTION CAPACITANCE




FIG.2-TYPICAL FORWARD




FIG.5 - TYPICAL REVERSE
