# TPSM64406EVM 36-V, Dual, 3-A Output, Synchronous, Buck Module



# **Description**

The TPSM64406 evaluation board showcases the features and performance of the TPSM64406, dual buck DC/DC module with integrated power MOSFETs and inductor. The EVM provides dual 3-A outputs. The output voltages can be individually programmed to a fixed 3.3-V, 5-V or adjustable using external feedback resistors.

The default switching frequency at full load is programmed to 1 MHz. The switching mode at the light load is selectable between FPWM and PFM mode. Each channel can be enabled or disabled by a jumper selection. Finally, spread spectrum can be enabled or disabled by a configuration resistor selection. The TPSM64406EVM is designed to demonstrate the full capabilities of the device on a single PCB design.



## 1 Evaluation Module Overview

## 1.1 Introduction

The TPSM64406 is a highly integrated 36-V input capable, DC/DC design that combines power MOSFETs, a shielded inductor, and passives in an enhanced HotRod<sup>™</sup> QFN package. The device supports either dual output or high current single output using an interleaved, stackable, current-mode control architecture for easy loop compensation, fast transient response, excellent load and line regulation, and accurate current sharing with an output clock supporting up to 6 phases for currents up to 18-A. The module has VIN and VOUT pins located at the corners of the package for optimized input and output capacitor placement. A large thermal pad beneath the module enable a simple layout and easy handling in manufacturing. See Figure 2-1 for a more detailed description.

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


Figure 2-2. EVM Test Setup

With an output voltage from 1-V to 16-V, the TPSM64406 is designed to quickly and easily implement a low-EMI design in a small PCB footprint. The total design requires as few as six external components and eliminates the magnetic selection from the design process. An example dual output solution can be shown by Figure 2-2.

Although designed for small size and simplicity in space-constrained applications, the TPSM64406 module offers many features for robust performance: precision enable with hysteresis for adjustable input-voltage UVLO, and spread spectrum for improved EMI. Along with integrated VCC, bootstrap and input capacitors for increased reliability and higher density. The module can be configured for constant switching frequency over the full load current range (FPWM), or variable frequency (PFM) for higher light load efficiency. Including a PGOOD indicator for sequencing, fault protection, and output voltage monitoring.



## 2.2 EVM Connections

Working at an ESD-protected workstation, make sure that any wrist straps, bootstraps, or mats are connected and referencing the user to earth ground before power is applied to the EVM.

Refer to the connections depicted in Figure 2-2 for a visual guide on powering up the EVM.

- 1. Connect the input voltage supply between VIN\_EMI and GND (J1) terminals using short thick wires.
- 2. Connect the load for the 5-V output between VOUT1 and GND (J6) terminals using short thick wires.
- 3. Connect the load for the 3.3-V output between VOUT2 and GND (J7) terminals using short thick wires.
- 4. Connect the input voltage sense lines to TP1 (VIN EMI) and TP2 (GND).
- 5. Connect 5-V output voltage sense lines to TP15 (VOUT1\_S+) and TP13 (VOUT1\_S-).
- 6. Connect 3.3-V output voltage sense lines to TP16 (VOUT2 S+) and TP14 (VOUT2 S-).
- 7. Set the input voltage (VIN) at the appropriate level between 6.3-V to 36-V.
- 8. Set the current limit of the input supply to an appropriate level depending on the connected output load.
- 9. Make sure VOUT1 ENABLE is set to ON by having the jumper in appropriate position on J2.
- 10. Make sure VOUT2 ENABLE is set to ON by having the jumper in appropriate position on J3.
- 11. Make sure Frequency Select is set to desired operating frequency by having the jumper in appropriate position on J4.
- 12. Make sure SYNC is set to desired mode by having the jumper in appropriate position on J5.
  - a. Short SYNC to GND for PFM Mode operation.
  - b. Short SYNC to VCC for FPWM Mode operation.
- 13. Turn on the power supply. The default configuration of the EVM must power up to VOUT1 = 5-V, VOUT2 = 3.3-V
- 14. Monitor the output voltage and current. The maximum rated load current for each output is 3-A.








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




Figure 4-1. EVM Schematic




Figure 4-2. Top 3D View




Figure 4-3. Bottom 3D View






Figure 4-4. Top Layer Copper




Figure 4-5. Layer 2 Copper

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


Figure 4-6. Layer 3 Copper




Figure 4-7. Layer 4 Copper
